Initials Dances (2006)

I. R. Dance II. S. Dance III. F.K. Dance

These three dances for piano (fast-slow-fast) take in many different elements: the first « R. Dance » (R as in Rameau) is intended as a modern echo of 18th-century harpsichord writing with its jagged ornaments and winding, feather-light discourse, set off against jazz elements including inflections derived from the electric bass idiom. The second, « S. Dance » (S as in Slow) begins like a lingering, whimsical minuet that little by little livens into a romantic giddiness, eventually sinking into a hallucinatory mist in which the rhythms seem to dissolve into eternity. Finally, « F.K. Dance » - F.K. is both an allusion to funk and a secret dedication - uses an eight-note theme which subsequently undergoes development via wild, highly virtuosic motion in which one may come across snippets of boogie, funky ostinatos and a rhythmic trance, aspects that gradually break up the main theme while leading up to the final chords.
